**LVMPD CIT (Crisis Intervention Training):** Is provided to Chaplaincy graduates. Graduates participating in the CIT program must have background checks. CIT is a vital part of the Chaplaincy training; the class presentation is instructed by Sgt. Glen Wilde. Assistant Sheriff Ted Moody, is the founder of the LVMPD Crisis Intervention Team, which consists of officers who receive, specialized training geared to the needs of the mentally ill, and is the "father" of CIT in the state of Nevada.

### **Youth Crime Watch Training**

Youth Crime Watch of America is helping new charter organizations form across the US and around the world.

Youth Crime Watch of America has earned national recognition by Presidents Clinton, Bush and Reagan and was named as a U.S. Department of Education Exemplary Program of Excellence. In the first year of the program's implementation, students helped to reduce their school's drug problem by more than half by pinpointing drug pushers. In addition, chain snatchings, a prevalent problem at the time, were decreased by three quarters. Equally important was the change in the students' attitudes. They were learning they could make a positive difference. Students were reporting crime, saw positive results and enjoyed significantly improved morale and school spirit.

Education is the third of the nine basic Youth Crime Watch components. It may involve things such as public service announcements, music, posters, forums, and many other approaches that you might never have thought of as teaching but which serve to "spread the word." Your educational plan will be based, in part, upon what you want to accomplish. Your goals might include:

- Helping people to understand a problem (such as a sort of crime) and so that they can take action to prevent or stop it.  
Building the skills and knowledge of your audience.
  - Having everyone take a single action such as never letting their book bags out of their immediate sight.
  - Getting youth or others involved in an activity such as Crime Reporting.
