Introduction

Chaplaincy Nevada training is biblically based; which emphasizes Christ as the central figure and paradigm for all Christianity. Chaplains Certification and Academy studies and materials are endorsed after satisfying its specific education and training objectives outlined by the authority of Messages of Faith Ministry, E.D. and governing Chaplains body, of religious trainers. Chaplain Academy Body of Members must be Professionals in Education, Training, Pastors, Assoc. Pastors, Elders, Sr. Chaplains, and Licensed Psych./Counseling.

Preamble: Chaplaincy is grounded in initiating, developing, discipling, and bringing an appropriate amount of education and training under Messages of Faith Ministry, and its Chaplaincy Nevada division through the Academy and Basic Religious Studies. This includes: Religious Studies and further education, Professional trained Overseer's, Teamwork and Collaboration, Ethical Practice which guides decision making and professional behavior, Confidentiality which respects the privacy of chaplains personal and educational information.

Religious Education Curriculum has been described at each phase level: 1, 2, and 3.

The intent of this curriculum is to identify core religious education and training concepts for each phase level and articulate these in “making it plain” language.

The structure of these phase levels are based on the triune God (God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit) and the purpose driven life for those that are called to serve as chaplains.

We believe that there are five steps that are followed to have an encounter with God, like Isaiah did in *Isaiah 6:5-8*:

1. Be convicted of sin.
2. Repentance of sin.
3. Being cleansed by God.
4. Being called by God.
5. Respond to God's call to feed His sheep.

It is our hope that this Grade Specific Religious Education Curriculum provides concise descriptors that identify what is to be learned and lived as we share the treasure of our faith with the children of God, on a life-long journey of being disciples for Christ.

MISSION

Our mission is based on the Holy Bible; with a ministry motivated by grace, repentance, forgiveness, redemption, and love of God. We are a traditional Christian Educational and Training Ministry that adheres to Word of God faith and values. To provide faith-based services, ministerial care and educational services which minister to both spiritual and emotional needs of all individuals. To provide support to our students/chaplains, and the ongoing purpose driven life that God has for them.



MESSAGES OF FAITH MINISTRY IS COMMITTED TO THE FOLLOWING STATEMENT OF FAITH.

1. We believe the Bible to be the inspired, the only infallible, authoritative Word of God.
2. We believe that there is one God, eternally existent in three persons; Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

6. We believe in the resurrection of both the saved and the lost; they that are saved unto the resurrection of life and they that are lost unto the resurrection of damnation.
7. We believe in the spiritual unity of believers in our Lord Jesus Christ.

Members Standards & Code of Conduct

1. All Ministry Members will use integrity and respect at all times, and seek to promote accuracy, honesty, and truthfulness in all of their practices and responsibilities. All Chaplains understand as ordained clergy, you are set apart, and held to a higher standard as professional clergy holding Christian values and integrity first.
2. Members Chaplaincy work and faith are one, always acting in a behavior and manner honoring to God. Each member should be connected to and under the authority of a Christian church and Pastor.
3. Members are set to higher standards by living right lifestyles. All actions should be shining examples, raising Christ up and bringing God glory. Never put yourself in a position to have a complaint brought against you. Creating individual/private mentor./mentee relationships through partner programs is unacceptable.
4. Members will use integrity and respect at all times in the classroom, events, in the field, and in our daily lives.
5. Members will honor their agreements, assignments, oaths, authority, and responsibilities.
6. Members will be courteous, respectful, professional, fair, and impartial, at all times. Members should never use derogatory language or act in a derogatory or negative manner at any time.
7. Members are occupying and exercising positions of trust, and will not misrepresent themselves or use their clergy position for personal gain in any way.
8. Members will not degrade, belittle, or disrespect, nor discriminate, harass, retaliate, or intimidate other persons, based on (subject to, but not limited to) race, creed, color, politics, religion, disability, or peer compatibility.
9. Members will actively pursue relationships and fellowship with the other ministries and churches within their community and state for sharing the good news, partnerships, leadership, and as one in the body of Christ.
10. Members will contact their Admin and/or instructors for tardiness, absences, etc. in the classroom.
11. Members are responsible for each monthly check in and volunteer hours. Suspension after 3 missed months.
12. Members shall not use any avenue or vehicle (subject to, but not limited to) media, functions, social media i.e. Facebook, twitter, instagram, MySpace etc., to use/share negative, sexual, derogatory, hate, cursive speech, or sexual, provocative photos, or shares that are contrary to living a right lifestyle in Christ.
13. Members understand they take oaths during their Ordination process that denounces sin, unrighteousness, carnal worldly desires and lifestyles, and agree to pick up the mantle of Christ and righteous living. Understanding that they have responsibilities as anointed, appointed, and ordained professional clergy to act in a professional right manner at all times.
14. Member Warning/Suspension result accordingly, after evidence is reviewed of 1-3 fractions of Code violation and a majority AB vote. Lesser violation can result in a written warning. Three written warnings shall result in suspension from the ministry, revocation of licenses, inability to use Chaplaincy NV logo, which includes, business cards, clothing apparel, etc.

CURRICULUM OVERVIEW AND PROMOTION REQUIREMENTS

Cost: There are no incurred costs for all levels of training, upon validation.
Chaplain members and students pay for their personal polo shirts, ID, patches and lapel pins.

Class Location: Metro Complex (Corner of MLK & Alta)

Spring Session: March, April, and May – *Level 100, Level 200, and Level 300*

Summer Session: June, July, and August - *Level 300 and Specialty Classes*

Fall Session: September, October, and November - *Level 100, Level 200, and Level 300*

Winter Session: December, January, and February - *Level 300*

Transcripts: Your transcript will include all Levels and sessions completed. Pass or incomplete.

Certificates: Are only given upon the completion of Levels 100, 200, and 300, not sessions / classes.
Specialty classes are the only exception to the rule.

Requirement to be a Lay Chaplain

Level 100 – Basic Chaplaincy

- 24 hour certificate program.
- Must completely fill out application and submit it at least two weeks prior to the start of class.
- Must pass basic chaplaincy course.
- Students receive a MOFM certificate upon completion of this course.

Requirement to be an Ordained Chaplain

Level 200 – Chaplain Ordination

- 12 hours certificate program.
- Must be called by God.
- Must pass basic chaplaincy course Level 100.
- Must sign and submit the MOFM **Academy Letter of Commitment**
- Must submit a **Letter of Recommendation** from your pastor or a religious leader of your church.

Requirement to be a Senior Chaplain

Level 300 – Chaplains Academy

- 12 to 24 month certificate program.
- Must pass Level 100 and Level 200 courses.
- Must volunteer **5 hours** a month on a MOFM program. **Examples:** Coffee Clutch, Chapel Service at WestCare, Human Trafficking events, Chaplains Quarterly Fellowship...etc.
- Students receive MOFM certificate and State certificate if applying for an officiate license. Upon completion of Levels 100, 200, Services Courses (311, 312) and one additional level 300 course.
- Students receive MOFM Senior Chaplain certificate upon completion of Levels 100, 200, 300 and submission of a 2,000-word autobiography on, **“Your Journey of Faith”**.

Level 400 – Specialty Courses

- Must be a chaplain for Messages of Faith Ministry.

Requirement to attend the “Grow Your Ministry”

Level 500 – Empowering Group

- Must complete Level 100, 200, and 300 courses and submit a Ministry Business Outline.

- Must attend group session on a regular basis. Group session will be in person (public) and online.
