RELIGIOUS EDUCATION & TRAINING CURRICULUM

Introduction

Chaplaincy Nevada training is biblically based, which emphasizes Christ as the central figure and paradigm for all Christianity. Chaplains Certification and Academy studies and materials are endorsed after satisfying its specific education and training objectives outlined by the authority of Messages of Faith Ministry, E.D. and governing Chaplains body, of religious trainers. Chaplain Academy Body of Members must be Professionals in Education, Training, Pastors, Assoc. Pastors, Elders, Sr. Chaplains, and Licensed Psych./Counseling.

Preamble: Chaplaincy is grounded in initiating, developing, discipling, and bringing an appropriate amount of education and training under Messages of Faith Ministry, and its Chaplaincy Nevada division through the Academy and Basic Religious Studies. This includes Religious Studies and further education, Professional trained Overseer's, Teamwork and Collaboration, Ethical Practice which guides decision making and professional behavior, Confidentiality which respects the privacy of chaplains personal and educational information.

Religious Education Curriculum has been described at each phase level: 100,200,300,400,500,600. The intent of this curriculum is to identify core religious education and training concepts for each level and to articulate the information in easy language.

The structure of these phases is based on the triune God (God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit) and the purpose driven life for those that are called to serve as Chaplains.

- *I.* We believe that there are five steps that are followed to have and encounter with God, like Isaiah did in *Isaiah6:5-8:*
- 2. Be convicted of sin.
- 3. Repentance of sin & Forgiveness
- 4. Washed by the Blood
- 5. Redemption & Salvation
- 6. Respond to God's call to feed His sheep.

It is our hope that this Grade Specific Religious Education Curriculum provides concise descriptors that identify what is to be learned and lived as we share the treasure of our faith with the children of God, on a life-long journey of being disciples for Christ.

STATEMENT OF FAITH

- 1. We believe the Bible to be the inspired, the only infallible, authoritative Word of God.

 Always be on time for class, this also avoids class disruptions, after 2 significant tardy's you will be dropped from a 4-16 session class. For a 2-session class there is no room for tardy's

unless you contact your instructor prior to class. On a 2-4 session class you must attend all sessions. 6-8 session class you must attend 5-7 sessions. On a 16-session class you must attend

14 sessions. You must complete the class essays required for the missing classes in order to receive your class credit.

3.Respect and courtesy are absolute at all times. in the classroom, during breaks, with instructors and with peers. 4. Dress appropriately at all times, No "shorts". No heavy perfumes etc. due to other allergies.

<u>Chaplaincy Nevada Training</u>: is biblically based, which emphasizes Christ as the central figure and paradigm for all Christianity.

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<u>Religious Certifications</u>: is an official document attesting to a status or level of achievement in religious studies: A certificate program is a specialized education designed to develop or strengthen specific career skills.

Certificate programs are available in more traditional academic and religious studies. These can be offered by professional organizations, 501c3's, ministries. or academic institutions, depending on the type of credential sought.

Certificate programs are an excellent option for ministry leaders who may already have a degree, or not, but are seeking credentials in a specific area of their ministry. They can also help ministry volunteers gain further knowledge and training in their area of service.

The more advanced certificate programs will dive deeply into the subject area or review more sophisticated methods for learning. In certification training, the graduates can leave with skills well-developed, and their base-knowledge expanded. Certificate programs are comprehensive, career-oriented courses of study, offered via classroom, online, and hybrid formats, and provide entry level or advanced skill sets valued by religious institutes, and employers in a variety of career areas. A certification program can also be a quicker accomplished option to gain valuable and essential information.

A certificate in ministry is a training and educational program that allows you to quickly get the foundational training needed. Courses can cover a range of ministry-related topics that can help you prepare to step into the field or improve one's formal training as a current ministry professional.

Accreditation is voluntary. Religious schools are not required to be accredited. Accredited schools must meet certain standards, offer degree programs, meet expenses, meet the requirements for distributing federal financial aid to students. They are more costly and take much longer to complete. However, you cannot put a price on education!

Graduate Applications: You must apply online to graduate for SR/BCC/Seminary. All applications are on-line. Graduate Essays: Are required. Essays are to be between 2000–2500-word essays. Information is listed on line at the Academy

Evaluations: Please complete evaluation forms at the end of your class completion. Instructions will be given out by your instructors. You may also fill these out online.

Log-books: Are the responsibility of each Chaplain to maintain for their own records and references. You may email the Administration for your transcripts during times of graduation.

Welcome to Academy: All classes are strictly volunteered and offered at no-fee.

The Board Certification implies that the chaplain has gone above and beyond that minimal standard of ministerial specialty by way of additional education and study and has passed a trial/examination to demonstrate it.

Professional certification is proof of achievement awarded to someone for completing a training program that qualifies them to perform a Chaplaincy service and/or job. Like any qualification, professional certification involves extensive study and an acquirement of understanding/knowledge.

Board certification is the process by which one acquires and can professionally demonstrate a basic knowledge, and skills through written, practical, class lab/testing, in-field service, hours, and merit. Certification is important because it assures you that the Chaplain skills, integrity, and experience have been carefully scrutinized by the ministry board of experts, and leaders, and found to be exceptional. Board certification is the process by which chaplain candidates demonstrate their competence, and ability to function as a professional chaplain in servantry and community in a professional chaplaincy manner and excellence.

The role of a Chaplain is to provide "emotional, spiritual, religious, pastoral, ethical, and/or existential care" in a religious or secular setting.

Messages of Faith Ministries is a non-denominational Christian Ministry, licensed since 2001 NV State Incorporated, and a Federal 501c3 since 2001, by whose bylaws reflects one of its main objectives is to establish religious education, training, and certifications.

Board Certified Chaplains graduate under the approval of the Ministry Ordained Professional Clergy Educational Board after meeting all requirements.

There is no accreditation or licensing requirement for any religious schools, seminary, academy, etc. Religious school accreditation or licensing is optional. Only Non-religious, private schools must be either licensed or accredited. Accreditation in the USA is purely a voluntary process and is NOT required for any religious studies. MOFM is a no-fee Christian Chaplain training academy
